What is this TXT Fondue program about?

What is the House Feast Network? Explore the Bible together and discover how in this day, King Jesus wants to work through His Holy Spirit, who lives and works in His followers.

This TXT Fondue is different from others

In this TXT Fondue, things are a little bit different. Page 2 contains a proclamation describing a unique kind of Biblical gathering at home, which we call a house feast. You've got to experience that some time; it's a completely different way of being a church together.

Together, you will complete this proclamation using Bible verses. It helps if everyone has a Bible to look up the verses. If there are no Bibles available, then let the opposite team read the verses to you from their answer sheet.

Two teams take turns in filling in the blanks. Team 1 is red, team 2 is blue. The answers can be derived from the Bible verses. The team that needs to supply the answer, has one minute to do so. Each team has the answers for the other team on their answer sheet. This way, they can judge whether the blank has been filled in correctly. In that case, the other team receives one point.

The first letter of each word is already provided, and the number of underscores indicates the amount of letters the word is composed of.

Referee

Like the referee ensures that the rules of play are respected, the elder in a house feast supervises that all that is said remains Biblical (1 Timothy 4:16). There are just two rules: if someone says something unbiblical, the elder takes corrective action, like a referee in football issues a yellow card. In case of sin, he intervenes, comparable to a red card.



2. table

Luke 14:15: "When one of those at the table with him heard this, he said to Jesus, 'Blessed is the one who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God."

4. rescued

Isaiah 35:10 (= Isaiah 51:11): "And those the LORD has rescued will return. They will enter Zion with singing; everlasting joy will crown their heads. Gladness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away."

6. An elder

Titus 1:6–9: "An elder must be blameless, faithful to his wife, a man whose children believe and are not open to the charge of being wild and disobedient. Since an overseer manages God's household, he must be blameless—not overbearing, not quick-tempered, not given to drunkenness, not violent, not pursuing dishonest gain. Rather, he must be hospitable, one who loves what is good, who is self-controlled, upright, holy and disciplined. He must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it."

Revelation 22:18–19: "I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this scroll: If anyone adds anything to them, God will add to that person the plagues described in this scroll. And if anyone takes words away from this scroll of prophecy, God will take away from that person any share in the tree of life and in the Holy City, which are described in this scroll."

10. asking questions

Luke 2:46: "After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions."

Deuteronomy 4:29: "But if from there you seek the LORD your God, you will find him if you seek him with all your heart and with all your soul."





14. guidance of the Holy Spirit

This answer sheet is for team 2 (blue). It contains the answers to the questions for team 1 (red). Team 1 begins and team 2 checks after a minute if the answer corresponds with the answer provided below.

1. royal priests

1 Peter 2:9–10: But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

3. King Jesus

Luke 22:49: "When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said, 'Lord, should we strike with our swords?"

5. discuss

Luke 24:13–16: "Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; but they were kept from recognizing him."

7. other religions

Leviticus 19:4: "Do not turn to idols or make metal gods for yourselves. I am the LORD your God."

9. seeking

Psalm 69:32 (in some translations 69:33): "The poor will see and be glad—you who seek God, may your hearts live!"

11. result

Proverbs 4:7 (CEV): "The best thing about Wisdom is Wisdom herself; good sense is more important than anything else."

13. arrogance

Proverbs 16:18 (GNB): "Pride leads to destruction, and arrogance to downfall."





15. gods

1 Corinthians 12:2: "You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols."

17. building

Acts 7:48–49: "However, the Most High does not live in houses [temples] made by human hands. As the prophet says: 'Heaven is my throne, and the earth is my footstool. What kind of house will you build for me? says the Lord. Or where will my resting place be?'"

19. our hearts

Romans 5:5: "And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us."

21. with gratitude

Colossians 3:16–17: "Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

Ephesians 4:12: "For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."
